Post Fire Floods: BE PREPARED!

Fire increases the risk of **flash floods**, so keep an eye to the sky. Know what the weather is doing around you and be prepared to move to higher ground if necessary. Sonoma OneRain is a resource through Sonoma Water that provides real-time rainfall, river-stream and reservoir data: <https://sonoma.onerain.com/home.php>

Have an emergency kit ready in case you need to leave your home in a hurry. Be sure to have enough medication, water, clothing and non-perishable food for 14 days.

If your home survived the fire, it is highly recommended that you obtain National Flood Insurance Program home insurance from FEMA. Speak with your insurance agent for details.

- **No-Till Drill** rental sign-ups through the Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District. The cost is free for those that have been impacted by the fire. For residents within the District the cost is \$150/day and \$200/day for outside the district. Call the GRRCD to make your reservation. Renter is responsible for pick up and drop off of the drill.

Benefits of using a No-Till Drill include;

- Reduces non-point source pollution
- Reduces soil erosion
- Protects water quality
- Helps build soil structure
- Reduces chemical runoff
- Reduces soil compaction
- Provides a permanent ground cover and retains soil moisture

- **Forestry/Landowner Assistance** Cal Fire administers several state and federal forestry assistance programs with the goal of reducing wildland fuel loads, improving the health and productivity of private forest lands, and expanding and improving management of trees and related vegetation in urban communities across California. The Forest Stewardship Program and California's Forest Improvement Program (CFIP) offer cost-share opportunities to assist individual landowners with land management planning, conservation practices to enhance wildlife habitat, and practices to enhance the productivity of the land. The Urban Forestry Program provides technical expertise and grants to create and maintain sustainable urban forests. Utilizing experts in forest pests and diseases, the Forest Health Management Program provides information to landowners and makes recommendations to the Board of Forestry regarding the health of California's forests. The L.A. Moran Reforestation Center specializes in cone processing and seed storage to provide a vital, long-term depository to private and corporate landowners for their future seedling needs.

USDA Disaster Assistance Programs:

- **Emergency Loan Program** to help producers recover from production and physical losses due to natural disasters.

Emergency loan funds may be used to:

- Restore or replace essential property
- Pay all or part of production costs associated with the disaster year
- Pay essential family living expenses
- Reorganize the farming operation
- Refinance certain debts

Applications for emergency loans must be received within eight months of the county's disaster or quarantine designation date. **Contact local FSA office for details and more information.**
